PARISH COUNCIL PRECEPT

The Parish Council have asked me to explain how the precept is calculated as, despite the council not asking for any more money from the District Council, on the official report it appears that the amount paid by households has gone up by over 4%. This is because the PC have to ask for an amount of money. For 2016-17 they asked for the same as for the previous year.

This amount is split by the number of households that pay Council Tax in Carlton. If the number of occupied households, number of people who pay reduced Council Tax etc changes, then the amount is divided differently and each household has to pay more or less accordingly. This is represented on the District Council's report as a percentage of the overall Council Tax so unfortunately sometimes you, as an individual or a household, end up paying more even though the PC only gets the same amount of money.
